



Project ROSE volunteers purchase, package, and deliver First-Night bags containing personal items and clothing for a woman's first night in a shelter, including clothing for children in their care. We provide household items for women in transition, and kits containing personal items and a change of clothes to victims of sexual assault. These items help provide hope, dignity, and a sense of normalcy. In partnership with St. Louis Community College, the program furnishes scholarships to individuals aspiring to improve their lives.


